## When the Bands Are Open but the Doors Are Closed Club Station Weather & Safety Expectations

On most Wednesday evenings and Saturdays, the club station comes alive with conversation, learning, and operating fun. It is our shared workshop, our signal lighthouse, and our gateway to the airwaves. But sometimes the weather has other plans.

### **Our Situation**

Our club is fortunate to be a guest of Northampton County, which generously provides the facility where our station operates. This location is not solely a radio site. It is an active county operations center where snow plows, salt trucks, and road crews deploy during weather events.

Snow plows and road equipment are staged and deployed

Heavy machinery and trucks are constantly moving

Crews work around the clock to keep roads safe

Access and parking areas must remain clear for operations.

During storms, this facility becomes mission-critical for the county. Additional vehicles or foot traffic from club activities could unintentionally interfere with those essential operations.

### **Safety Comes First**

The board has established a simple guiding principle: safety always comes first. When weather creates hazardous travel, unsafe parking conditions, or could impact county operations, the station may be closed.

### **Recreational vs. Emergency Operations**

Amateur radio has a proud tradition of serving during emergencies. If the club is activated to provide emergency communications support, the station may open specifically for that purpose. However, routine operating, social gatherings, or

contests do not outweigh safety or the county's operational needs.

## How Decisions Are Made

Based on current and forecasted weather conditions

With safety of members as the top priority

With respect to county operational requirements

Communicated as early as practical

## Our Commitment

We value our partnership with Northampton County and are committed to being respectful guests. Maintaining this relationship ensures long-term access to the station and positions us to help when our community truly needs us.

The bands will still be there tomorrow. When conditions improve, the station doors will reopen, and we will be back on the air together.



## **ARRL AND RENEWALS**

Since there were a few new members at every meeting, I thought it was time to talk about ARRL membership.

All ARRL members need to check their QST mailing slip to see when their membership expires. Now members have to decide on what they want to do.

By now, you should know that the price of membership went up a few years ago. The biggest change is that if you want to continue getting QST or On the Air magazines in the printed form, it will cost you \$25 per magazine. If you are willing to get those magazines in digital form, there are no extra cost

You have a choice in how many years you want your membership. One year is \$59 and 3 years is \$175. You still have to pay \$25 a year for the printed form of the magazines.

The Club benefits from ARRL membership by getting a commission on new members and members that renew. It is not much, but every little bit, it helps the Club. In order to be an Affiliated Club, you need to have at least 51% of the voting members be Full members in the Club. At least 51% of the voting members must be licensed radio operators.

## WEDNESDAY NIGHT NETS

Additional Net Controls are needed for the Wednesday Night ARES, RACES & DLARC net. If we have enough interested operators, it will only be necessary for each operator to have only one net session in each three-month period. 13 weeks in a period, then 13 net controls would be ideal, and some extras to fill in if needed.

This would give us a pool of experienced controls, for any emergency which would arise. Interested operators should contact George, N3SQD at [george@bioserv.com](mailto:george@bioserv.com). The NIMS IS-700 and ICS-100 courses are not needed to be a net control, but should the need arise, and we do supply controls and operators for real emergencies, then the courses requirement will be in effect and EMA issued IDs will need to be on the scene of an emergency.

All Radio Amateurs are welcome to take part in the ARES, RACES and DLARC net. This net meets Wednesday at 1900 hours local time, on the W3OK Repeater 51.76, 146.70 and 444.90 (pl 151.4). With an alternate frequency of 147.135 + DPL 315) W3OI Repeater. Other inputs are the 146.85 repeater, (151.4 PL) and Echolink at K2PM-R.

QCWA Chapter 17 holds a net Monday evening at 7:30 PM on 3958 +/- depending on conditions.

Mid-Atlantic D-Star Net meets each Tuesday at 7:30 PM. The following repeaters Dstar repeaters are available in the Lehigh Valley. W3OK -145.11000MHz -0.600 Port C – W3OI -147.16500MHz +0.600 Port C, – W3OI - 445.02500MHz -5.000 Port B

All repeaters on the net are linked through **Reflector 020 port A**, so all stations checking into the net should make sure that they have *their local repeater call sign followed by the letter "G" in the eight positions of the RPT2 field*. Otherwise, you will only be heard locally and not over the Reflector. Dongle users wishing to check into the net should Log On by connecting directly to Reflector 20, port A, rather than through your local repeater to conserve local bandwidth.
