Proceedings:

A quorum being present, the Secretary called the meeting to order at 1900 hours.

President's Report:

Nazareth's Day is 19 July starting at 9 am. Terry is looking for volunteers to set up at the Nazareth Park. Terry said that Larry, Jay Reid, Adam said that he will be there after he locks up the Milkhouse. Terry said he will be there. He has not heard anything from George or Al. Terry said that we will be set up over on the other side from last year, so that we are closer to the people walking by, food, and all that stuff. Sue recommended that we get a table. Terry said he will pay \$10 for the table if we have enough people like last year. Sue said the we could use a Morse code machine and teach kids how to spell their name with Morse code. Terry said that we may not have to set up a radio and do all the stuff because no one was interested last year. George had it all set up. He brought his own radio with a telescopic antenna. Terry said that there were some people, but not a whole ton of people that was interested. What we decided whether we are going to support her now, we will have to let Sue know, and she will figure out a place for us to get so we can go.

Terry said that the other question he has is that a Club member asked if he could have a key to the Club station. He is working for us more frequently. There was a lengthy decision about this and after hearing what others had to say, it was decided that no keys will be given out until the new Security System is installed and working correctly.

Secretary's Report: John, N3IGA, asked if there were any corrections or additions to the minutes as printed in the Newsletter. Motion to accept the report was made by Dean. Second, by Adam. Vote was taken, and motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Larry, KC3JTK, presented said Treasurer's report for the month of May. A motion to accept the report was made by Dean. Second by Adam. Vote taken, and motion carried.

New Business:

Adam wants to discuss the new Security System to inform the Board what is planned. Since the Club Station has a budget, Adam does not need to make a motion on the spending of the new system. The system is another Swann. There are 4 cameras, 4 channels, and a full HD DVR. One camera to cover the radio desk towards where the tools are at the end of the bench. Another camera will cover the other radio stations facing the doorway. That way there are no dead spots not covered. Then the front room will have a camera facing towards the door and the other camera facing the wall where the archives are. Again, no dead spots will be found. Adam said the he and John, N3IGA, have an idea drawn up and we both will install the system. We are going to set it up where it will not go to an individual's email account like we had with the last one. It will go to a dedicated email for the Security system. Adam said the only he and John will have the information to get into the system. He reassured that all the information will be in the Football if something happens to John or him. It will have step by step instructions that any stupid person will be to understand how to access and to change passwords. He said that he will do everything that needs to be done. Adam said the he did not know how the Board feels about it, but we need something in the Milkhouse more elaborate than just one camera in the Radio room and one in the Front room. This system costs \$230 + tax. That is right off the Swann's website. That is for everything according to their website ships free. Adam was asked to at least inform the Tech Committee. He said that he will as soon as he knows that the Board approved the new System and will email them before he leaves tonight. He said that he will CC both Terry and John. The total cost of the system including tax came out to be \$245. Adam said that for legal reasons, there will be signs all over the Milkhouse saying there is a video surveillance in use on these premises. Adam said that with the signs up and having no audio, that is all the Club has to do. Adam made the motion that we get

this system and John seconded it. Before any voting, it was asked if anyone had any questions or concerns. There was no questions or concerns. So, 100% were in favor of it. Adam sent an email to the Tech Committee. Adam was told that there is a need for receipts for everything needed to install the system. Adam said that he had somebody come up to him with two suggestions about Field Day. The first suggestion was to set up a Field Day committee so that way they can start meeting up at the beginning of the year. It was said different people. Adam was asked to bring this up and Adam answered. Adam told this person okay, and thanks for the information. I will bring up the people on the Board. Terry said that we have a committee. George helps with the computers, Larry does the antennas along with Barry, KU3X. Ben, N3WR, sets the Networking. Adam does the radios. Dean does the Safety side of Field Day. It was mentioned that why do people want to change things when things are working so well. It is hard to find members to volunteer for so many Club positions. Why reinvent the wheel when things are going so well. The other thing was about having a good breakfast instead of Donuts. Something was said about having it for Saturday and Sunday. It was said that there is enough work in setting up the site that there is really no need for any "breakfast" on Saturday since most people eat breakfast early and not around noon. Adam said that he can do breakfast on both Saturday and Sunday with eggs and other items for the operators that worked all night making contacts and to kick start the operators coming in to operate. Old Business: Larry said that he finally got the radio talking to the computer after a week of fighting with it. He said the kind of up and running. VE TEST SESSION

On 11 July 2025, there will be a VE Testing Session at the Northampton County 911 Center at 7pm. Candidates are required to pre-register. You must contact Bob Green, KE3AW by phone 610-419-9286 or email address ke3aw@arrl.net. Bob will inform the candidate on what is required and prohibited, etc., the date, time, location, verification required, directions, etc. The candidates need to know they should get their FRN number prior to the testing. If they do not have that FRN number (SS number cannot be used), it will slow their paperwork flow and delay the license delivery to them. They also need to know the fee set by ARRL for their part in the checking process before their paperwork is sent to FCC in Gettysburg, and if paying by check, it shall not be made to any member of our VE Team nor to DLARC. And finally, the \$35 the feds are charging for their 10-year license.

The NIMS IS-700 and ICS-100 courses are not needed to be a net control, but should the need arise, and we do supply controls and operators for real emergencies, then the courses requirement will be in effect and EMA issued IDs will need to be on the scene of an emergency.

Mid-Atlantic D-Star Net meets each Tuesday at 7:30 PM. The following repeaters Dstar repeaters are available in the Lehigh Valley. W3OK -145.11000MHz -0.600 Port C – W3OI -147.16500MHz +0.600 Port C, – W3OI - 445.02500MHz -5.000 Port B

All repeaters on the net are linked through **Reflector 020 port A**, so all stations checking into the net should make sure that they have their local repeater call sign followed by the letter "G" in the eight positions of the RPT2 field. Otherwise, you will only be heard locally and not over the Reflector. Dongle users wishing to check into the net should Log On by connecting directly to Reflector 20, port A, rather than through your local repeater to conserve local bandwidth.
