President's Report: Dean, AB3BD, commented on the success of the club's recent Open House event and thanked everyone who assisted in making it a successful and enjoyable day for visitors and members alike.

Guests: Andy (no call sign yet) attended as a guest and was warmly welcomed by the club.

Secretary's Report:

Secretary Wayne Westfield, N3FQ, asked if there were any additions or corrections to the previous meeting minutes as published in the club newsletter.

Motion to accept the minutes: Moved by Jay and seconded by Bob. Motion carried

Treasurer's Report:

Larry, KC3JTK, presented the Treasurer's Report for the month of March.

Club Station: Adam, N3LAG, thanked Aiden for his outstanding work during the Open House event. Aiden will serve as the club's new Youth Coordinator. Two new radios were purchased for the club station: Yaesu FT-710 and Icom IC-7300. Station cleaning and Field Day preparation activities will take place on June 13.

George noted that several north-facing windows in the Milk House are missing panes or windows and suggested using plexiglass as a repair solution.

Technical Committee: No report.

Website Committee: No report.

New Business:

Jay reported that a memorial service for Bob Green will be held in June.

Aiden announced that a new weekly roundtable net will be held on the club repeater every Thursday evening except during club meeting weeks.

Barry reminded members that the Kutztown Antique Radio Meet would be held this Saturday.

Old Business:

Larry provided an update on the satellite station antenna and radio project.

The previously used eggbeater antenna did not perform well enough for the club's location and intended use.

A redesigned antenna system is being developed with hopes of having the project operational for Field Day.

Larry explained that rotating the boom by 45 degrees produced approximately an additional 1 dB of gain.

Barry asked whether the missing interface cable had been located, and Larry confirmed that it had been found.

Dean asked for an update regarding the transition of VE testing sessions to digital testing methods. Ralph stated that progress depends on John, who was unable to attend the meeting. Ralph also noted that the W3OI club has conducted

related training activities for the EPARA club and plans to speak with John during the next VE testing session.

2026 Will Be DLARC's 80th Year Participating in Field Day By Barb Wiemann, W3TC

This year marks DLARC's 80th consecutive year participating in ARRL Field Day. According to Clarence Snyder W3PYF, the club first set up for the June event in 1947, the year after DLARC was founded.

During the first 23 years, 1947-1969, DLARC operated from at least 12 different sites. We do not have records for all of the early years. In 1950, the club operated from Montana Mountain in Harmony Township, New Jersey. Participants included President Henry Thyhsen, Vice President Lewis Papp W3MAC, Secretary Clarence Snyder, and former president Edward Hart Jr. W3NF. 25 members manned 4 stations powered by 3 generators; adverse atmospheric conditions prevented contacting stations in far western states.

In 1952, Chestnut Hill on Rte. 115 north of Easton was Field Day home. Using a 20' x20' tent to shelter 3 operating stations, members contacted 422 stations in 30 states. In 1953, members logged 582 contacts, placing DLARC 7th in its class in the United States.

Sell Field in Bethlehem was Field Day location for three years, 1954-1956. In 1954, with four-hour shifts, two operators per station, members contacted 709 stations from 43 states. The next year DLARC logged 751 stations from 44 states and five Canadian provinces. However, in 1956, heavy thunderstorms knocked transmitters off the air, and the club managed only 512 contacts.

After operating from an urban setting, DLARC sought a mountain top experience. In 1958, Field Day was held at Gaffney Hill in Williams Township. Among the 630 contacts were stations in the West Indies and the Canal Zone. In 1959 the club returned to Montana Mountain. Northampton County allowed the club to use its communications vehicle (an Army surplus ambulance). 15 members stayed on site for the entire 24 hours and helped log 672 contacts, including Puerto Rico. In 1960, the club ventured to South Mountain.

For four years, the club used various Nazareth area locations - Potter's Field, the Old Indian Burial Ground, and a "Nazareth hilltop." In 1962 two members brought their mobile amateur television station to try to make contact.

The club's 600 contacts placed DLARC 7th in the country in their class. In 1963, members logged a station in Greenland among 1017 contacts, a club record. In 1964, with over 800 contacts, the club placed 11th in their class. 937 contacts in 1965 moved the club up to 10th place.

From 1966 to 1969, Field Day moved from Sell Field to a farm in Martins Creek to the Lehigh University Practice Fields to Tannersville in Monroe County. 1966 saw a new record high 1112 contacts from 46 states, Canada, and the Canal Zone. Robert Rothrock K3MAZ brought his amateur television station and managed two contacts.

After this peripatetic beginning, Hackett Park in Easton was Field Day home for 22 years, 1970-1991. The club enjoyed consistency and based operations from the Plainfield Farmer's Grove for 19 years from 1992-2010. During the last 16 years, the club has moved between Louise Moore County Park (7 years), East Allen Bicentennial Park (7 years), and Lower Milford Fire Company (2 years).

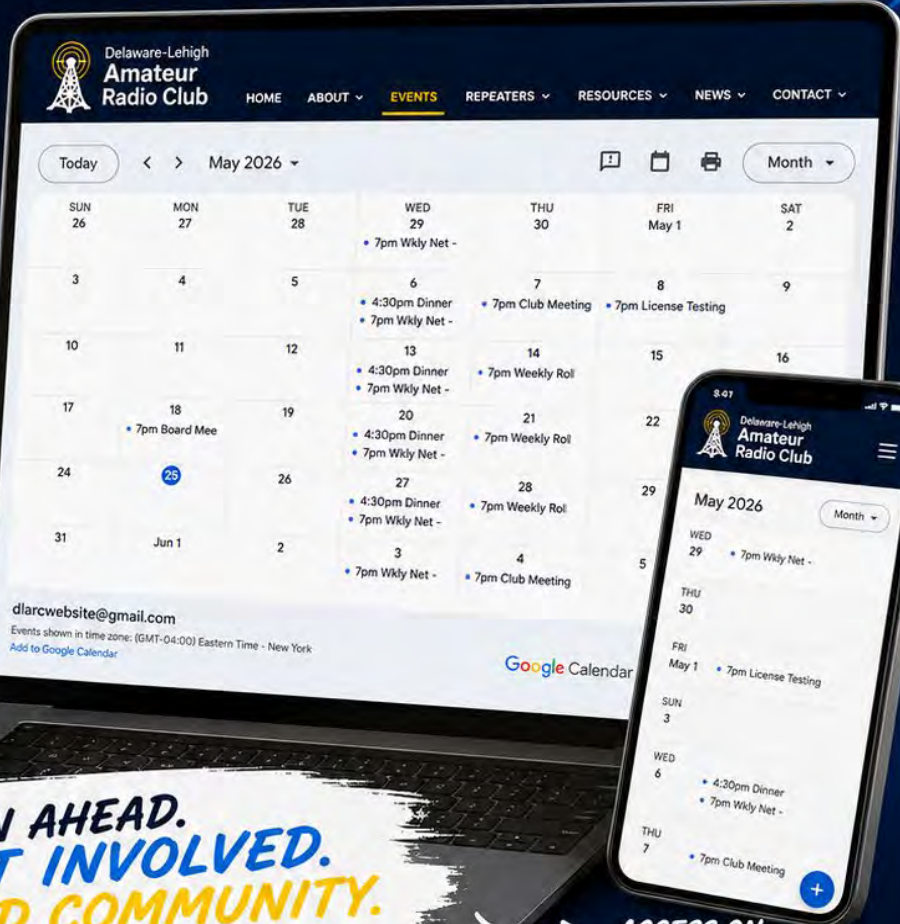

WEDNESDAY NIGHT NETS

Additional Net Controls are needed for the Wednesday Night ARES, RACES & DLARC net. If we have enough interested operators, it will only be necessary for each operator to have only one net session in each three-month period. 13 weeks in a period, then 13 net controls would be ideal, and some extras to fill in if needed.

This would give us a pool of experienced controls, for any emergency which would arise. Interested operators should contact George, N3SQD at george@bioserv.com. The NIMS IS-700 and ICS-100 courses are not needed to be a net control, but should the need arise, and we do supply controls and operators for real emergencies, then the courses requirement will be in effect and EMA issued IDs will need to be on the scene of an emergency.

NORTHAMPTON COUNTY ARES, RACES AND DLARC NET

All Radio Amateurs are welcome to take part in the ARES, RACES and DLARC net. This net meets Wednesday at 1900 hours local time, on the W3OK Repeater 51.76, 146.70 and 444.90 (pl 151.4). With an alternate frequency of 147.135 + DPL 315) W3OI Repeater. Other inputs are the 146.85 repeater, (151.4 PL) and Echolink at K2PM-R.

QCWA Chapter 17 holds a net Monday evening at 7:30 PM on 3958 +/- depending on conditions.

Mid-Atlantic D-Star Net meets each Tuesday at 7:30 PM. The following repeaters Dstar repeaters are available in the Lehigh Valley.
W3OK -145.11000MHz -0.600 Port C – W3OI -147.16500MHz +0.600 Port C, – W3OI - 445.02500MHz -5.000 Port B

All repeaters on the net are linked through **Reflector 020 port A**, so all stations checking into the net should make sure that they have *their local repeater call sign followed by the letter "G" in the eight positions of the RPT2 field*. Otherwise, you will only be heard locally and not over the Reflector. Dongle users wishing to check into the net should Log On by connecting directly to Reflector 20, port A, rather than through your local repeater to conserve local bandwidth.
