New Business:



Emergency Go Kits By George, N3SQD

The program for the night was on Emergency Go Kits. George,N3SQD gave it. He had a slide presentation explaining the different kinds of emergency. He explained that it is up to the individual on what goes in a Go Kit (or Go Bag). He explained what he took and why. If you do not have a Go Bag already made up, make up a list of things you will need to take with you. Keep that list handy so that if you are sent somewhere, you have all the items needed to keep going.

George told about being deployed during Hurricane Sandy and the experience from it. He explains the procedures that was taken to find where radio operators were needed.

The next thing George was to show what he carries in his Go Bag. He has one for any radio he needs to take with him. Showed the items he takes to make sure he can recharge any batteries that he uses, his cellphone, and even a fan. He explained that everyone will have to make their own Go Bag with stuff that he will need. Everybody has their own ideas of what they want.

WEDNESDAY NIGHT NETS

then 13 net controls would be ideal, and some extras to fill in if needed. This would give us a pool of experienced controls, for any emergency which would arise. The NIMS IS-700 and ICS-100 courses are not needed to be a net control, but should the need arise, and we do supply controls and operators for real emergencies, then the courses requirement will be in effect and EMA issued IDs will be needed to be on the scene of an emergency.

QCWA Chapter 17 holds a net Monday evening at 8:30 PM on 3960 +/- depending on conditions. Other inputs are the 146.85 repeater, (151.4 PL) and Echolink at K2PM-R.

Mid-Atlantic D-Star Net meets each Tuesday at 7:30 PM. The following repeaters Dstar repeaters are available in the Lehigh Valley. W3OK - 145.11000 MHz -0.600 Port C - W3OI -147.16500 MHz +0.600 Port C, - W3OI - 445.02500 MHz -5.000 Port B

All repeaters on the net are linked through **Reflector O20 port** A, so all stations checking into the net should make sure that they have their local repeater call sign followed by the letter "G" in the eight positions of the RPT2 field. Otherwise, you will only be heard locally and not over the Reflector. Dongle users wishing to check into the net should Log On by connecting directly to Reflector 20, port A, rather than through your local repeater to conserve local bandwidth.
