WINTER FIELD DAY 2026

Winter Field Day is sponsored by the Winter Field Day Association. We passionately believe that Ham radio operators should practice portable emergency communications in winter environments as the potential for freezing temperatures, snow, ice, and other hazards present unique operational concerns. WFD is formatted to help increase your level of preparedness for disasters and improve your operational skills in subpar conditions.

Winter Field Day is a communications exercise. WFD is held on the last full weekend in January. WFD can be worked from the comfort of your home or in a remote location. You can participate by yourself or get your friends, family, or whole club involved. Winter Field Day is open to participants worldwide. Amateur radio operators may use frequencies on the HF, VHF, or UHF bands and are free to use any mode that can faithfully transmit the required exchange intact. Similar to the ARRL's Field Day, bonus points are earned in several ways, including using non-commercial power sources, operating from remote locations, satellite contacts, and more.

To be clear, WFD is an EMCOM exercise, so do not get too hung up on our rules. At the end of the day, your total points do not matter. What you learn during WFD and your ability to adapt and overcome sudden obstacles will help you during unexpected emergencies. As we continue with another year of the WFD exercise, we want to encourage participants not to chase the contacts or the points but to evaluate their abilities and equipment. If you want to exchange signal reports, please give each other accurate information so the other station knows how well their station is working.

Winter Field Day is held the last full weekend in January. For 2026, it will be held on January 24th and 25th. The 24-hour operational period starts at 1600 UTC (11 am local) on Saturday, the 25th, and ends at 2159 UTC (4:59pm) on Sunday, the 26th. If you want more information about this, you can go to the website, https://winterfieldday.org and check out with it is all about. If interested, check the rules out at the same time.

The Club Station will open for this event. There will be an announcement about that in the future to all DLARC members by mass email.

A quorum being present, the Secretary called the meeting to order at 1901 hours.

President's Report: Dean explain what he expects from the BOD so that everyone is on the same page.

Secretary's Report: John, N3IGA, asked if there were any corrections or additions to the minutes as printed in the Newsletter. Motion to accept the report was made by Terry. Second, by Adam. Vote was taken, and motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Since Larry is out of town, Terry said that there was no update information since he gave the report at the General Meeting. A motion to accept the report was made by Adam. Second by Henry. Vote taken, and motion carried.

New Business:

There was something said in the beginning of the Meeting about Zoom and having Bill at the meeting on Zoom. Terry said that the Club needs to do something about Zoom. Andrew had one more thing go over. He informed the members present that the Trustee for W3OK needs to be renewed next year. John told him that since Barry has been doing this for at least 30

years, he knows what needs to be done and ahead of it already. Then Andrew asked what would happen if a Trustee would die. Dean said that the BOD would choose who to the next Trustee. Then Andrew asked about a database for members to show when their license needs to be renewed. John said that everything that you see about Amateur Radi, it clearly states that it is up to the person to renew his license. He said that in all the years as a Ham, he never heard anyone mention that they forgot to renew their license. He said that the ARRL or W5YI will send reminding Hams that their license needs to be renewed. They have two years to renew which they still get reminders. He said that he has had Club email him on how to get their license from FFC. I wrote a step by step way to download your updated License. Andrew asked Joh for a copy of his roster. John told him that he was not on the Distribution List per the By-laws. Bill came in and told Andrew that he can download the Club Membership off the website. He told Andrew what he had to do. Terry said that people are nervous about having their name and address available to just anybody. People do not need to be scammed or hacked. Dean asked if there was any more New Business. Alan said that he still had something to say. Adam said that on this Friday, John and He will be changing the locks at the Club Station. ARRL AND RENEWALS

Since there were a few new members at every meeting, I thought it was time to talk about ARRL membership.

All ARRL members need to check their QST mailing slip to see when their membership expires. Now members have to decide on what they want to do.

By now, you should know that the price of membership went up a few years ago. The biggest change is that if you want to continue getting QST or On the Air magazines in the printed form, it will cost you \$25 per magazine. If you are willing to get those magazines in digital form, there are no extra cost

You have a choice in how many years you want your membership. One year is \$59 and 3 years is \$175. You still have to pay \$25 a year for the printed form of the magazines.

The Club benefits from ARRL membership by getting a commission on new members and members that renew. It is not much, but every little bit, it helps the Club. In order to be an Affiliated Club, you need to have at least 51% of the voting members be Full members in the Club. At least 51% of the voting members must be licensed radio operators.

WEDNESDAY NIGHT NETS

Additional Net Controls are needed for the Wednesday Night ARES, RACES & DLARC net. If we have enough interested operators, it will only be necessary for each operator to have only one net session in each three-month period. 13 weeks in a period, then 13 net controls would be ideal, and some extras to fill in if needed.

This would give us a pool of experienced controls, for any emergency which would arise. Interested operators should contact George, N3SQD at george@bioserv.com. The NIMS IS-700 and ICS-100 courses are not needed to be a net control, but should the need arise, and we do supply controls and operators for real emergencies, then the courses requirement will be in effect and EMA issued IDs will need to be on the scene of an emergency.

Mid-Atlantic D-Star Net meets each Tuesday at 7:30 PM. The following repeaters Dstar repeaters are available in the Lehigh Valley. W3OK -145.11000MHz -0.600 Port C – W3OI -147.16500MHz +0.600 Port C, – W3OI - 445.02500MHz -5.000 Port B

All repeaters on the net are linked through **Reflector 020 port A**, so all stations checking into the net should make sure that they have *their local repeater call sign followed by the letter "G" in the eight positions of the RPT2 field*. Otherwise, you will only be heard locally and not over the Reflector. Dongle users wishing to check into the net should Log On by connecting directly to Reflector 20, port A, rather than through your local repeater to conserve local bandwidth.
