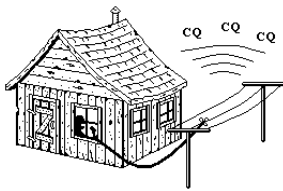
### Meeting January 8<sup>th</sup> at IU20
