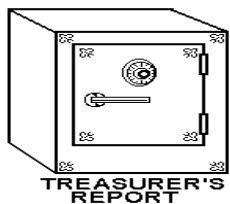
Again, Chris/NU3L and George/N3SQD will be the lead instructors.
