"AA3WM this is W3DEA."

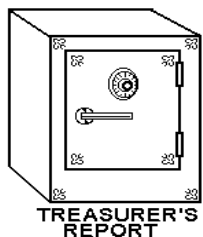

Conterra Harness

The Conterra Harness is a versatile tool when working in the field. Your radio is right in front of you and it keeps your hands free. The harness that I use has a large pocket on the left. This can be used to store an extra battery pack and note pad and what ever else you have. In the middle there is a space for a pen. The compartment for the radio is adjustable, so just about any radio will work. On the right shoulder strap is an elastic band to keep your antenna close to you so it doesn' t flop around.
