Amy Zimmerman Award

Purpose:

Ham radio-related humanitarian act, deed, or service that benefited the community. This award was originally conceived as a memorial to Amy Zimmerman for her service to the community and amateur radio.

Details & Criteria:

- **a.** Qualifying act, deed, or service should benefit those outside of amateur radio (example: hams working with non-hams.)
- **b.** A single extraordinary act, deed, or service could qualify (example: working the 9/11 disaster).
- **c.** Qualifications should not include normal everyday operating or contesting.
- **d.** Qualifications should not include being an event chairperson of a single event every year (coordinating a single event every year would not necessarily qualify).
- 1. An individual may receive the award more than once, but not for the same recurring act, deed, or service. And only one individual may receive the award per year.
 - **a.** A description of the act, deed, or service which qualified the individual for the award must be entered into the E-Board minutes
 - **b.** And the minutes of the general club meeting at which the award was presented.
- 2. Only DLARC club members in good standing are eligible for the award. They must also have been members of the club at the time they performed the activities for which the award is being considered.
- **3.** The award is to be considered and reviewed each year, but may not necessarily be presented each year if there are no qualified candidates.
 - **a.** A three-person committee is to be formed each December by the E-Board consisting of the past president and two club members at large.
 - b. The committee's function is to determine candidates who qualify for the award, (either through suggestions from other club members and / or their own deliberations,) and present them to the board of directors at the January E-Board meeting, as potential recipients. The

board of directors may add to or subtract from the committee's list of nominees the name of any qualified club member whom they believe does or does not meet the eligibility requirements of the award.

- **c.** The award winner will be decided by a majority vote of the E-Board.
- **4.** The award consists of the following: The Amy Zimmerman Plaque, and a press release to the ARRL and local news agencies.
- 5. The wording on the award is listed below, with the clubs logo at the top:

CARL R. STEVENSON, PRESIDENT & CTO OF WK3C WIRELESS LLC, WINS ELECTION TO THE IEEE STANDARDS ASSOCIATION BOARD OF GOVERNORS FOR A TWO YEAR TERM BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2006 EMMAUS, PA, November 7, 2005 - Carl R. Stevenson has been elected to the position of Member-at-Large on the IEEE Standards Association's Board of Governors for a two year term beginning on January 1, 2006.

The IEEE-SA Board of Governors is accountable to the IEEE Board of Directors and the public at large to provide a broad spectrum of value-added industry standards, as well as standardsrelated products and services, to meet the needs of its constituency comprised of members from industry, government, and the general public.

It is the responsibility of the IEEE-SA Board of Governors and each Board member to uphold the reputation of the IEEE as a respected world leader in the development and promulgation of standards and to enhance the professional image of the IEEE, thereby adding strategic value to the IEEE Standards program.

Shortly after the public announcement of the election results on November 4, 2006, Mr. Stevenson received congratulatory e-mails from W. Cleon Anderson, IEEE President; Donald N. Heirman, President of the IEEE Standards Association; and Jim Carlo, Past President of the IEEE Standards Association.

Mr. Stevenson has been involved in the design and development of RF communications systems and equipment for over 35 years and is President and CTO of WK3C *Wireless* LLC, an Emmaus, PA, consulting firm specializing in the areas of wireless standards, regulatory affairs, and design services.

He is a Fellow of the Radio Club of America, a Senior Member of the IEEE, a member of the IEEE 802 LMSC Executive Committee, Chair of the IEEE 802.22 Working Group on Wireless Regional Area Networks, a Member-at-Large of the IEEE-USA Committee on Communications and Information Policy, has been named by Scientific American magazine as a Policy Leader within the 2005 SCIENTIFIC AMERICAN 50 - the magazine's prestigious annual list recognizing outstanding acts of leadership in science and technology from the past year, and is to receive the IEEE-SA 2005 International Award at an awards ceremony in Florida on December 4, 2005.

From its inception several years ago until November 2004, he served as Chair of the IEEE 802.18 Radio Regulatory Technical Advisory Group. He also previously served as the liaison tothe ITU-R for the IEEE's Sector Membership, Chair of the Wi-Fi Alliance Regulatory Committee, Chair of the Bluetooth SIG Radio Workgroup, and a member of the US Delegation to the World Radicommunications Conference 2003.

Mr. Stevenson said: "I am honored that the members of the IEEE Standards Association have entrusted this responsibility to me for the next two years and I look forward to the opportunity to serve the IEEE-SA, its members, and the IEEE as a whole."
