I was in the front of the parade and it was so long that the front ran into the back. I get a good feeling when using amateur radio to aid in public events. I urge anybody who hasn't participated in public service to do so at least once in the next year.

W3CE heartily thanked NC3P and the Nominating Committee for their efforts, to the applause of the members assembled.

Approval of September Minutes: Vic / N2OFF **moved** to accept the August minutes as printed in the on-line Newsletter. Seconded by Bill / N2DH, the motion was carried with one opposing (thought I missed that, didn't you, Ray?).

Approval of Treasurer's Report: Gary / N2AUO **moved** to accept the Treasurer's report as given. Seconded by Don / KC3II, the motion was carried without dissent.

REPORTS:

Membership: Membership Chairman Vic / N2OFF reported DLARC had at the time of the report 187 members. Vic also presented two new applications for membership: James / N3DW, Mike / KB3PDR Charlie / W3DEA **moved** to accept the above applicants into the Club. Seconded by Ken / N3IYX, the motion was carried without dissent. The new members were applauded by the members present.

Website & Repeaters: Brad / W3JXQ has assumed the role of DLARC Webmaster. Several members noted that most if not all of the For Sale items are horribly out of date. KC3II reminded everyone that those selling items are supposed to inform the webmaster when the items are sold.

W3OK Club Station – 'The Milk House': W3CE invited all Members to join the regular crowd every Wednesday evening at the Milk House. AI also informed the members present that the station's vertical antenna was to be tuned and reinstalled Friday, 03OCT08.

VE Session: George / N3SQD reported that no VE Session was to be held in October. There will be a session the day following the November meeting. VE sessions are held regularly; check the Calendar at <http://www.dlarc.org> for dates.

License Training Classes: Bob / KE3AW reported that another attempt to teach Technician licensing classes through Northampton Community College has fallen through with no students enrolled. W3CE noted there is interest in CW training classes, perhaps at the Milk House on a night other than Wednesday.

UPCOMING EVENTS

ARRL SET: W3CE reported that the ARRL Simulated Emergency Test (SET) will take place on Saturday 04OCT2008. Bob / WB3W reported that activity will occur in all 6 District counties, including Northampton. The SET will run from 0900 – 1200L. Northampton County's scenario will be that of a lost hiker; W3CE will "get lost" and all are invited to D/F him on the 2m repeater input frequency. Interested parties may also listen to 3987.5 MHz, the District coordination frequency.

WX3MAS Special Event Station: Chairman Lou / KB2VCI reported that advertisements promoting the event have been submitted to CQ, QST and World Radio magazines. The Special Event Station will be on the air 13-14DEC2008, in a room in the Greystone Building (next to the Milk House). Ops are needed! The last few years have been dying down, in terms of interest and activity. W3CE exhorted the members present to come out and help! Contact KB2VCI or any Officer/Board Member to volunteer.

Emmaus Halloween Parade: George / N3SQD reported (on behalf of Bob / KE3AW, who was off counting votes) that volunteers are still needed for the Parade, to take place on 18OCT08 from 1800-2130L. For those who have not participated before, it is a great deal of fun – you'll actually be in the parade!

OLD BUSINESS:

SKYWARN Training: W3CE announced that an Advanced Spotter class will be conducted at the Carbon County Emergency Management Office in Nesquehoning on 18OCT08 at 1100L – you must have completed the Basic class in order to attend. A Basic class is being considered at this time, but no details are known.

NEW BUSINESS:

Amending of Bylaws: W3DEA **moved** that DLARC amend its bylaws to read: "The Club will provide free Associate Membership to licensed amateurs under the age of 18. Full Membership will remain \$12 for the entire year." Seconded by N3OW. Passed without dissent.

2009 Meeting Dates: W3CE reported that Club dates for 2009 will be posted to the Website as soon as they are approved by the Executive Committee. AI also noted several meeting date changes from the normal day – first Thursday of each month – due to holiday conflicts: January 2009's meeting will take place on the 8th, and July's on the 9th of that month.

Presentation: W3CE presented KC3II with an ARRL certificate appointing him Radio Officer for Northampton County, to the applause of the members present. Good luck, Don!

More New Applicants: Pete / NL7XM announced more new applicants for Club membership: Peter Manson / K2PM; Daniel Manson / KB3GHT. N2AUO **moved** to accept the above-named applicants as Members, seconded by Bill / K3ANS. Approved without dissent.

There being no further business for the Members present, W3CE **closed** the meeting from the Chair at 2023L. The program which followed was devoted to the PA QSO Party by WB3W.

PENNSYLVANIA ANTENNA BILL PASSED

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF PENNSYLVANIA SENATE BILL No. 884 Session of 2007

INTRODUCED BY GREENLEAF, ROBBINS, COSTA, FONTANA, BROWNE, STOUT,
REGOLA AND DINNIMAN, JUNE 1, 2007
AS AMENDED ON THIRD CONSIDERATION, SEPTEMBER 23, 2008
AN ACT

Amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, restricting municipalities from regulating amateur radio service communications.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Title 53 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:

§ 302. Restriction on municipal regulation of amateur radio service communications.

- (a) General rule.--A municipality that adopts an ordinance, 11 regulation or plan or takes any other action involving the placement, screening or height of antennas or antenna support structures shall reasonably accommodate amateur radio service communications, and shall impose only the
- (b) Reasonable accommodations.--A municipality may impose necessary regulations to ensure the safety of amateur radio antenna structures, but must reasonably accommodate amateur service communications. No ordinance, regulation, plan or any other action shall restrict amateur radio antenna height to less than 65 feet above ground level.
- (c) Construction.--The provisions of this section shall not be construed to prohibit a municipality from taking action to protect or preserve a historic, a historical or an architectural district that is established by the municipality or pursuant to Federal or State law.
- (d) DEFINITION.--AS USED IN THIS SECTION, THE TERM "LEGITIMATE PURPOSES" SHALL INCLUDE A CLEARLY DEFINED HEALTH, SAFETY OR AESTHETIC OBJECTIVE OF A MUNICIPALITY.

Signed into law, October 8th 2008 by Governor Ed Rendell.

Now known as Act 88. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

RACES EMERGENCY REQUIREMENTS

As of September 2006, NIMS IS-700 and ICS-100 course certifications are required for participation in on site RACES emergency operations. These courses can be taken on line by going to www.fema.gov and following the directions. These certifications are also necessary in order to receive the county photo IDs. These IDs will be forth coming, but at this time the fire, police and other emergency groups are being taken care of first. These requirements are not needed to participate in the weekly Wednesday nets. The only requirement for these nets is a valid amateur radio license and an interest in emergency communications.
