

#### THE DLARCforum

A few years ago the Executive Committee established an electronic mailing list for D.L.A.R.C. Members and friends to provide an easy way to disseminate information on a timely basis. This mailing list is called the "DLARCforum" and all club members with email capability are welcome to join.

Joining the list is easy, just go to this website : <a href="http://mailman.qth/mailman/listinfo/dlarcforum">http://mailman.qth/mailman/listinfo/dlarcforum</a> and fill in the appropriate boxes. Instructions for the subscription process are available on the page. If you don't have internet service, but do have email service you can still subscribe by sending a subscription request directly to the list administrator, ka3jwe@arrl.net.

The DLARCforum is a "closed" list which means only subscribers can post messages, so your mailbox won't be filled with junk mail from unknown sources. The list uses a "text only" format which means, that only messages in plain text are passed. Messages received in HTML are filtered and stripped of any formating before being sent out to list subscribers. The list will not accept or pass attachments such as files and pictures. This is done to eliminate the possibility of spreading any type of computer virus or other harmful programs. The forum is an "un-moderated" list, which means that there is no moderator screening messages before they are passed on.

Since its beginning, the volume of messages on the DLARCforum has been relatively low compared to other similar mailing lists. So don't worry your your inbox won't be overflowing with messages if you subscribe. There is also the ability to configure your preferences for the list to your personal liking.

So, please consider joining the list if you're not already subscribed. You'll be better informed about current club activities and also have the knowledge and experience of over half the membership at you disposal. Anything you want to know, all you have to do is ask!

### **WEDNESDAY NIGHT NETS**

Additional Net Controls are needed for the Wednesday Night ARES, RACES & DLARC net. If we have enough interested operators, it will only be necessary for each operator to have only one net session in each three month period. Actually 13 weeks in a period, so 13 net controls would be ideal, and maybe some extras to fill in if needed. This would give us a pool of experienced controls, for any emergency which would arise. Interested operators should contact Don / KC3II at kc3ii@arrl.net. The NIMS IS-700 and ICS-100 courses are not required to be a net control, but should the need arise and we do supply controls and operators for real emergencies, then the courses requirement will be in effect and EMA issued IDs will be needed to be on the scene of an emergency.

#### HARD COPY SUBSCRIPTIONS

Sign up now for your hard copy newsletter subscription. The rate again this year will be \$10. This is strictly for the newsletter so as to cover printing and mailing. Our club membership number no longer allows us to use bulk mailing, thus the first class postage requirement. That plus paper and printer supplies have to be covered since a member is doing the printing on his own printer. To subscribe contact Pete / NL7XM at nl7xm@arrl.net.

### **NIMS ICS-100 CLASSES**

Northampton County Emergency Management will look into setting up a class for the NIMS ICS-100 course. The course would require at least 12 interested operators and could possibly be held at the Northampton County 911 Center. ### RACES EMERGENCY REQUIREMENTS

As of September 2006, NIMS IS-700 and ICS-100 course certifications are required for participation in on site RACES emergency operations. These courses can be taken on line by going to www.fema.gov and following the directions. These certifications are also necessary in order to receive the county photo IDs. These IDs will be forth coming, but at this time the fire, police and other emergency groups are being taken care of first. These requirements are not needed to participate in the weekly Wednesday nets. The only requirement for these nets is a valid amateur radio license and an interest in emergency communications.


It was also decided by the Lifetime Membership Committee to induct two new members at this time. They being Bill Goodman / K3ANS and Ray Bilger / W3TDF.

### ARRL PRESENTS NEW MEMBERSHIP BENEFIT

From The ARRL Letter

With just a mouse click or two, ARRL members can now access the online QST magazine archive

<a href="http://www.arrl.org/members-only/ggnsearch.html">http://www.arrl.org/members-only/ggnsearch.html</a>.

This new benefit -- a service of the ARRL Technical Information Service (TIS) <a href="https://www.arrl.org/tis/">http://www.arrl.org/tis/</a> -- provides PDF copies of all QST articles from December 1915 through December 2004, enabling members to view and print their favorite article, project and more. Access to the new online digital QST archive is free for ARRL members.

The ARRL Periodicals Archive and Search lists every article for QST from 1915 to the present, QEX from 1981 to the present, Ham Radio from 1968 to 1990 and NCJ from 1973 to the present (please note that beginning in 1998, each issue of QEX covers two months). Only ARRL members will be able to download and print copies of the QST articles.

### The 2nd Running of the DLARC 2 Meter Sprint

A Sprint is a short, and usually very quick, competition. In ham radio it is just that, a short fast contest. I have been asked to, again, host this FUN event, and re-state the rules, which are basically the same as last year.

DATE & TIMES: Saturday, March 28, 2009; 10AM to 11AM, (please use) Local EST.

**ELIGIBILITY:** Must be a paid up DLARC member, as indicated in the 2009 roster.

**OBJECTIVE:** Contact as many other DLARC members, (ONCE ONLY), as you can.

**FREQUENCIES :=** Any 2-meter FM simplex frequency, (ie. 146.52, 146.55, 146.58). No repeater contacts permitted. (This does not restrict you from asking someone on a repeater to QSY to a simplex frequency).

**CATEGORY :** Single Operator only. Mobile contacts are valid, but only one log to be submitted, which should show all contacts made.

**EXCHANGE**: A sequential serial number (starting with #1), Your Call, and the day of the month of your birthday. (Example; If your birthday is May 14 - you give 'Check 14', [but not the month]).

**LOGS**: You must use, and submit, paper (handwritten) logs only. The top of the log sheet should show your call and the check number sent. The columns of the log should look like this;

|# Sent | Time | # Rcvd | CALL | Day # |

(You can pre-number the #Sent column).

**Example;** If you are my 5th contact, and my Birthday is May 14, my exchange to you would be "number 5 from W3TDF Check 14"

**SCORING**: It's very simple. 1 (one) point for each completed contact made. No multipliers.

**LOG SUBMISSION**: Completed logs may not be mailed. They must be turned in at the April 2. meeting. The winner will be announced during the break at this meeting.

Remember, this is a FUN event. Most everyone should have 2-meter capability. You could sit in your car, even with an HT, on top of a hill, (for 1 hour), and make lots of contacts.
