NEW BUSINESS:


Knife Show: Bill / K3ANS announced he was holding a knife show.

FOX HUNT AT THE 2010 PICNIC by NL7XM



I hadn't heard in time that there was going to be a 2m Tx foxhunt at this years' DLARC Picnic, so I was not equipped to participate. But I DID have my camera with me, so I got to document the event, and had a lot of fun doing that because I was close to the action.

The device was planted (hidden) by **AI / W3CE** well before Members arrived at Louise Moore Park around noon on a picnic-perfect day, albeit under a solemn atmosphere being the 9th Anniversary of the 9/11 attacks. Its intermittent beacon was remotely programmed to start at a predetermined time so no one could enjoy an advantage. Participants scrambled immediately, resulting in my not capturing images of all of them by the time I retrieved my camera from the car. So, not pictured are **N3SQD**, **N3INJ**, **N3OW**, **KB3KXR**, **KB3SXI**, **K3GMT**, **N3IYX**, **AA3OU**, **& N2AUO**.

With everyone going off in different directions, I had to hastily decide who I would follow if I wanted to witness the winner's discovery of the fox. As it turned out, I made the right choice. Jeff / N3QO headed east with a curious Bev, W3CE's XYL in tow, while everyone else immediately went south; George / N3SQD out in front with great authority. Jeff probably went 200 yards before the next 2 beacon cycles allowed him another bearing that now had him doubting why he alone went that way. I wondered if the others just followed George, betting he had the best equipment, intuition, or experience. A minute later would have Jeff among the other hounds, sniffing the brush, trees, fence posts, and trash that could be the fox in disguise. The signal was quite strong, even after disconnecting antennas from the HT's to achieve attenuation. Body blocking played a small role, but when the receiver was just saturated with the signal, Jeff employed a simple method of deviating from the operating frequency, giving him the tactical edge to discover the fox about 5 feet in front of him on the branch of a tree at eye-level. Arriving last in this area, it is entirely possible that others stood precisely in the same spot before Jeff, but failed to look anywhere except on the ground for it.

Jeff posed for the camera with his captured prey, proof of his success. Amazingly, no one heard our discussion or noticed me taking his picture, even though everyone was well within earshot. So we quickly abandoned the area as if still searching, deciding to leave the fox intact to give others a chance at placing 2nd. It was nearly an hour before it would be rediscovered. The Milk House hosted 127 visitors last month. Most of the activity is outdoors with Jon (N3INJ) and Barry (KU3X) making CW QRP a main stay in good weather. They put up a 20/40 dipole a few feet off the ground and see how far they can work with 5 watts. Here are a few pictures of recent activities at the Milk House.





Their kits now include a padded case to hold their Ten-Tec rigs and keys. Most people would buy an amp meter but Barry likes to build his tools.



Barry is discharging capacitors in preparation to performing the 10 meter modification to Dave's (K3GMT) new amplifier. Using a tool of his own design of course.





Laurie (KB3SIK) and Jon (N3INJ) sign the Milk House visitor book.

Gary (N2AUO) has rigged his portable mast with a 2 meter antenna to support the Black Bear Century Ride along the Delaware Water Gap National Park.



Barry gave Ken (N3IYX) and Dave (K3GMT) some tips in how to quickly prepare RG-400 for PL-259 coax connectors. Dave and Ken made new jumper cables for the club house and upgraded all the HF coax from Milk House bulk head (where the antenna feed lines enter the Milk House) to the central distribution panel with RG8.

Great connector prep tools from DX Engineering. The Red tool strips the jacket, shield, and center conductor (this one for LMR400 and RG8). The black tool helps you screw the connector over the jacket.





Ken (N3IYX) works DX with his IC-7000 and Ham Radio Deluxe while George (N3SQD) and Ben (KB3CTX) are reviewing the route for the Black Bear Century Ride.



After much cursing and rework Dave (K3GMT) finished building the Softrock SDR Lite+USB Receiver kit. This kit includes plug in band modules to cover 160-10 meters. Not a kit for the first time builder. There are 22 surface mount components to solder (Tip: Use dab of beeswax on a tooth pick to pick up and hold the components while you solder them). There are also 8 inductors to wind (Tip: count the "turn" each time the wire passes through the center of the core). Dave plans to use the Softrock to run CW Skimmer and pass through the spots to N1MM during CW contests.

SEARCH FOR EXTRA_TERRESTRIAL UINTELLIGENCE USING YOUR PERSONAL COMPUTER AT HOME Part 2

In Part 1 I had mentioned that you should have tuned-up your PC(s) and this is the reason for that. You can participate by running a free program Berkeley Open Infrastructure for Networking Computing (BOINC). The latest released version, 6.10.58. (7.22 MB file) will run with Windows XP or later, MAC OS X 10.3.9 and later and Linux kernel 2.2.14 or higher, glibc 2.3.2 or higher. If your computer is equipped with a Graphics Processing Unit (GPU), you may be able to use it to compute faster. As normal make sure your computer satisfies their minimal requirements.

The program lets you donate your idle computer time to science projects like <u>SETI@home</u>, which will be the project we focus on. Others are Climateprediction.net, <u>Rosetta@home</u>, World Community Grid, and many others. After installing and running BOINC you can connect it to as many of these projects as you like if you're the owner of the computer. If your not the owner of the PC in which the client software was installed then you must have the permission of its owner.

Here your PC will be used in the background running special software that will analyze space-born signals coined the radio "waterhole" from the radio telescope at Arecibo. The waterhole refers to an especially quiet band of the electromagnetic spectrum between 1420 and 1666, corresponding to wavelengths of 21 and 18 centimeters respectively. The strongest hydroxyl spectral line radiates at 18 centimeters, and hydrogen at 21 centimeters. These two combined form water, and water is currently thought to be essential to extraterrestrial life advanced enough to generate radio signals.

Radio telescope signals consist primarily of noise (from celestial sources and the receiver's electronics) and man-made signals such as TV stations, radar, and satellites. Modern radio SETI projects analyze the data digitally. More computing power enables searches to cover greater frequency ranges with more sensitivity. Radio SETI, therefore, has an insatiable appetite for computing power.

Previous radio SETI projects have used special-purpose supercomputers, located at the telescope to do the bulk of the data analysis. In 1995, they proposed doing radio SETI using a virtual supercomputer composed of large numbers of Internet-connected computers with the initial software platform called "SETI@home Classic", which ran from May 17,1999 to December 15, 2005. The original intent of SETI@home was to utilize 50,000-100,000 home computers. Since it was launched the project has logged over two million years of aggregate computing time using over 5.2 million participants worldwide.

The <u>SETI@home</u> Classic version was replaced by <u>Berkeley Open Infrastructure for Network Computing</u> (BOINC), which also allows users to contribute to other distributed computing projects at the same time while running SETI@home. The BOINC platform will also allow testing for more types of signals. On May 3, 2006 new work units for a new version called "SETI@home Enhanced" started distribution.

The ACC does the majority of the work right from your home computer. We have lost a good number of Affiliated and Special Service Clubs simply through the lack of renewal information. The ACC's main responsibility is to keep in contact with each of the clubs and remind them of the need to submit the needed information.

The Eastern Pennsylvania Section of ARRL is among the larger (ARRL membership) in the country. With that in mind I am asking as many as possible to get involved and help keep the EPA Section at the level it deserves. I also remind you that among the positions you should be considering is the Section Manager's position.
