Instructions for the subscription process are available on the page. If you don't have internet service, but do have email service you can still subscribe by sending a subscription request directly to the list administrator, ka3jwe@arrl.net.


The DLARCforum is a "closed" list which means only subscribers can post messages, so your mailbox won't be filled with junk mail from unknown sources. The list uses a "text only" format which means, that only messages in plain text are passed. Messages received in HTML are filtered and stripped of any formatting before being sent out to list subscribers. The list will not accept or pass attachments such as files and pictures. This is done to eliminate the possibility of spreading any type of computer virus or other harmful programs. The forum is an "un-moderated" list, which means that there is no moderator screening messages before they are passed on.

Since its beginning, the volume of messages on the DLARCforum has been relatively low compared to other similar mailing lists. So don't worry your your inbox won't be overflowing with messages if you subscribe. There is also the ability to configure your preferences for the list to your personal liking.

So, please consider joining the list if you're not already subscribed. You'll be better informed about current club activities and also have the knowledge and experience of over half the membership at you disposal. 
We will try to cover operation on the 20, 40 and 80 meter bands with some mix of SSB, CW, and PSK31.



the HF bands. Well not so. I have a "long" wire here that gets used on 2 m - and for this some form of ATU is handy - here is a simple one I made.

It has 2x100-pF Variable Capacitors (because that is what I had at the time) and the coils are 5 turns on a 5 mm former. As you can see basically it is a PI configuration (same as is in the MFJ units - but a fraction of the price).

It can also act as a stand alone antenna base for a 1/4 wave or even 5/8 - but you will need some sort of counterpoise (hence the terminal on side) - and will match/tune (what ever you want to call it) most 2 m antennas and wires. The ATU can stand 50 w through this with no problems as it depends on the Variable Capacitors that are pretty wide spaced. The ATU may solve a problem (with antenna matching) or allow you to use a long wire or even a Rhombic if you have room for it.

W3OK -145.11000MHz -0.600 Port C – W3OI -147.16500MHz +0.600 Port C, – W3OI - 445.02500MHz -5.000 Port B All repeaters on the net are linked through **Reflector 020 port A**, so all stations checking into the net should make sure that they have *their local repeater call sign followed by the letter "G" in the eight position of the RPT2 field*. Otherwise, you will only be heard locally and not over the Reflector. Dongle users wishing to check into the net should Log On by connecting directly to Reflector 20, port A, rather than through your local repeater in order to conserve local bandwidth.
