REFLECTIONS FROM THE PAST



WX3MAS 1969 THE FIRST OF 50

TAKING ADVANTAGE OF COAXIAL CABLE CAPACITANCE

Jeff Blaine, ACOC, had a bad capacitor in the 15-meter filter section of his 5B4AGN multiband band-pass filter, because as he puts it, "they have been treated terribly over the years." One way to damage a filter is to use power levels at the limit of the filter into a load that presents a high SWR -- especially a high duty cycle mode like RTTY. He didn't have the required small 14 pF capacitor, so he trimmed a piece of RG-58 to the required value - coaxial cable exhibits a certain amount of capacitance per unit length.

"The repaired 15-meter filter runs 1.10:1 or better SWR across the band with an insertion loss of about 0.65 dB," he reports. Blaine advises that the RG-58 "can be coiled up and secured with some tie wraps" and that it should be kept away from the toroid to minimize interaction -- a half-inch is probably sufficient. This approach may work well for other applications where a low-value capacitor is difficult to obtain and space is available.

Blaine uses an L/C meter to measure the capacitance as the piece of cable is trimmed to approach the target value, and he leaves the cable about a quarter of an inch, then trims the braid back to increase the distance between it and the center conductor. He puts shrink wrap over the end, and measures the passband of the filter section with the chassis cover in place.

NOVEMMBER PROGRAM REPORT

FILMING "ACCROSS THE PACIFIC" AND RADIOS OF PANAM

Across the Pacific is a soon-to-be-released documentary about one of the great milestones in aviation history; the crossing of the Pacific Ocean by a Pan American Airways flying boat known as the China Clipper.

The China Clipper's take-off from San Francisco Bay in November 1935 was one of the most-anticipated, mostlistened-to events in history to that point. The event was broadcast live over nine radio networks reaching millions of listeners on four continents.

Brian Harrison / KN4R discussed the filming of this documentary and how he and friends were able to provide period radios and accessories to help the project achieve authenticity. This program builds on his previous presentation on "Radios of the 1931 Lindbergh Survey Flights." (see the June issue of the W3OK Corral.)

Brian and his wife, Cathy, were in and around Boston for four days in support of the filming of some of the dramatic scenes for the documentary. He loaded up a pile of equipment, including vintage receivers and transmitters, telegraph keys, headphones, and reproduction batteries and headed on his journey north.

Brian said, "It was a 12 hour drive from my QTH to Tewksbury MA for the first days shooting, including Hugo Leuteriz's 1919 laboratory scene, the handful of different 'Key West Operations and Radio Room' scenes circa 1928, 'the DF Works' lunch meeting scene with Juan Trippe, the 'Alameda' scene where Leuteritz is listening for the overdue Hawaiian Clipper aircraft (which finally arrives safely), and finally, Leuteritz's 1940 'career recap' scene..."

"The last day's shooting ('airplane crash scene') was at a soundstage in Boston."

Brian's talk focused on four individuals who helped Pan American gain a leading place in international air travel.

- ●Pan Am's brash young chief executive, **Juan Trippe**, whose business acumen, political instincts and legendary foresight allowed him to build the world's largest airline by age 35. *
- •Igor Sikorsky, the Russian émigré who designed most of the flying boats that fueled Pan Am's meteoric rise in the 1920s and '30s. Though these odd aquatic aircraft may seem like nostalgic curiosities today, they played a critical role in the early days of commercial flight, particularly overseas.
- •Hugo Leuteritz, who invented the navigation systems that guided Pan Am's planes safely to their destinations. To cross the Pacific, Pan Am needed navigational methods that would allow its pilots to find their way unerringly across thousands of miles of trackless ocean. Leuteritz, before almost anyone else, realized the secret lay in radio - a technology that would be at the heart of virtually every navigational technique developed since the 1930s.
- •Charles Lindbergh was a well-known pilot and became the face of Pan American Airlines, Lindbergh's technical advice on the purchase of the Sikorsky S-40 aircraft was his first contribution to Pan American's acquisition of new equipment, but it would not be his last. Trippe said that Lindbergh "was in on virtually every decision of a technical nature that Pan American made." Although not a graduate aeronautical engineer, Trippe noted, "he understood flying totally, and he was a man with extraordinary vision."
